A proposal to create

Section 8 in Article IX of the State Constitution to require the Legislature to annually appropriate certain funds to be used towards postsecondary education financial assistance and to establish conditions on a student's eligibility to receive such financial assistance.

Be It Proposed by the Constitution Revision Commission of Florida:

Section 8 is added to Article IX of the State Constitution to read:

## ARTICLE IX EDUCATION

## SECTION 8. Financial assistance.

- (a) Postsecondary education is fundamentally a public good necessary for the creation and the maintenance of a skilled workforce and a vibrant economy in this state. It is therefore a paramount duty of the state to ensure the affordability of postsecondary education to the residents of this state, especially those residents of above-average merit or substantial financial need. In order to ensure the affordability of postsecondary education, beginning with the 2019-2020 fiscal year, the legislature shall, at a minimum, annually appropriate an amount equal to 100 percent of tuition and other fees for students qualifying for the Florida Bright Futures Scholarship Program or the Florida Public Student Assistance Grant Program.
- (b) At a minimum, a student must be in the 75th percentile of academic achievement to qualify for a scholarship under the Florida Bright Futures Scholarship Program. The student shall apply for the scholarship before earning a high school diploma

or high school equivalency diploma, or completing a home education program, and enroll in an eligible public or private postsecondary institution in this state within three academic years of graduation or separation from active military duty initiated upon graduation.

- (c) A student must demonstrate an annual unmet financial need of at least \$200 to qualify for a grant under the Florida Public Student Assistance Grant Program. The student shall apply for the Pell Grant or similar federal financial aid and enroll in an eligible public or private postsecondary institution in this state.
- (d) A student may use a scholarship or grant provided under this section toward the earning of any postsecondary credential.
